

FABULOUS VERSES TO MEMORIZE



Some verses are just so foundational they apply to numerous teachable moments. If you're looking for where to begin memorizing God's Word with your kids, these fifteen verses make a great place to start. The point of this list of verses is to identify "short and sweet" Scripture that can be real to children/youth. It is your job, as the parent, to help the child connect God's Word to his life. That means explaining the meaning, defining words, and giving examples of what the verses mean. Do not forget that very young children may not understand some of the wording, such as realizing that *Christ* means Jesus or that the you in Psalm 6:3 means God.
